In summary, although the combination of calligraphy and modern design provides great possibilities for the inheritance and innovation of calligraphy art, it also carries the risk of diluting the traditional meaning and artistry of calligraphy. In the process of pursuing creativity and modernization, designers need to carefully balance tradition and innovation to ensure that the core value of calligraphy as a cultural art form is not ignored or weakened.

CONCLUSION

In the context of globalization and informatization, Chinese calligraphy art needs to continue to seek a balance between inheritance and innovation. Cultural and creative product design plays an important role in the cultural communication of contemporary society. As a form of expression of traditional culture, calligraphy art has injected profound cultural heritage into the design process and endowed the product with a unique artistic atmosphere. The use of calligraphy elements is not only a decoration in design, but also injects new vitality into traditional culture. Through in-depth exploration of the cultural value, contemporary challenges and innovative integration of calligraphy with modern design, it is found that integrating calligraphy into cultural and creative products and modern design can not only enrich its expression form, but also expand the application field of calligraphy, injecting more diversified possibilities into calligraphy art. At the same time, this combination helps calligraphy to achieve cultural communication and market competitiveness in the context of internationalization. On the one hand, it is necessary to ensure the effective transmission of calligraphy cultural values by



strengthening the standardization of the education system and the joint efforts of all sectors of society. On the other hand, it is necessary to increase interdisciplinary research efforts to explore more possibilities of calligraphy in the fields of modern design, scientific and technological media and cultural communication. Through the combination of tradition and modernity, we can create works of art with cultural connotation and sense of the times, providing a new path for the inheritance of calligraphy, a traditional art form. It can not only bring new vitality to calligraphy art in local culture, but also showcase its unique artistic value and cultural charm on the international stage.

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
